ACTS has never lost its vision for serving the people of Burkina Faso through education related projects that empower the poor who have had little access to schools and training. Knowledge gives a people power over circumstances.



ACTS is committed to lifting people out of ignorance. This is why we are involved in education, professional training, literacy and also in equipping the Church.

The vision for equipping the Church includes leadership, discipleship and writer training. Writer training was added because it is important to have more locally produced literature for our people.

Habakkuk: 2: 2-3 “...Write my answer plainly on tablets, so that a runner can carry the correct message to others. This vision is for a future time. It describes the end, and it will be fulfilled. If it seems slow in coming, wait patiently, for it will surely take place. It will not be delayed.”

We will never stop encouraging the people to write. Writer training was one of the first visions of serving the Lord in Burkina.

Schools in Komsilga participated making 14 teams competing for the coveted cup. Students from all classes of College Ezra secondary school formed teams for the competition and the final match was played between the first year class and the last year class students.

The senior students from College Ezra won the cup. ACTS students were excited they had won the cup this year.

The tournament was preceded by six weeks of training in soccer, morals from biblical references, healthcare, preserving the environment and HIV/AIDS.

For the closing ceremony this year, we invited a businessman who owns a private university as sponsor of the ceremony.

- **Pray for protection and health for staff and villagers.** When rain comes, cases of malaria and dengue fever will increase. This is the number one killer of children around the world. Only God can protect us.
