Realities in Burkina Faso

- 45% of the population earns about \$1 a day
- 12% literacy rate lower among women
- Human Development Index ranks Burkina Faso 175 out of 177 countries
- 1 out of 5 infants die before their 5th birthday
- Life expectancy for women is 47 years
- Secondary school enrolment is 8%

ACTS restores dignity to the poor



Florence told officials and guests her story and explained how ACTS helps orphans and widows

"We could not attend school because our parents could not pay for our studies. We came to the ACTS Center and now we are learning sewing and carpentry. Widows learn skills such as soap production, dyeing cloth and weaving. We are fed everyday and we receive Bible teaching and good counselling and the staff prays for us. We are thankful to the people working for ACTS Ministry because they are angels sent by the Lord to save as the poor orphans of the village of Saonré."

This is part of the speech of Florence Nikièma, an orphan in the ACTS program in Saonré, during the Literacy Graduation ceremony held June 21.

Florence and other orphans like her are gaining confidence and skills that will give them a future as

they mature. When the orphans are ready to leave the ACTS Center and take their place in adult society, they will have solid Biblical principles to guide them.

Many friends of ACTS gathered in Saonré for the annual ceremony. Government officials, TV and radio reporters from Ouagadougou and friends all came to view the growth of ACTS programs.

For the widows and orphans who are recipients of the ACTS programs it was a time of rejoicing. The entire village took part.

Nearly 200 widows have decided to take steps to improve their life. They join ACTS program and learn about the love of Jesus Christ as that is the basis for all the other assistance and skill building activities. Village women are the least educated in Burkina Faso.

ACTS offers micro-enterprise to widows

ACTS begins by teaching women how to read. Then they are given classes in caring for home and children. They are given their choice of microenterprise opportunities—such as sewing, cloth dyeing, batik, drying of fruit and vegetables and soap making and animal production.

One of the widows in the program, Suzanne Ouédraogo, a young woman with two small children, gave her testimony. "ACTS is like a basket of provision fallen from the sky for me and my two children. I have hope again. I now feel useful thanks to what I have learned. I received credits to begin my small enterprise. Now I bring in a profit."

Claire Nassa is a widow of forty years old. She has several children of which three are very small. She chose to learn how to dye cloth for her microenterprise business. Claire says, "Since I started to attend the Center, the future has opened up for me and my children. I was given credits to open a workshop to sell beautiful cloth."

Every day more widows and orphans ask to be enrolled in the ACTS Ministry program. There are many more village women and orphans in desperate need. With your help, ACTS will reach more widows and orphans with the Good News of the Gospel.
